Since our inception, we have successfully placed over 525 animals into new homes, and expect to process at least 150 in this year alone. We can provide crates, food, vaccinations and vet care – all we need from you is a little love, a little patience, and a warm place for the animal to sleep while it waits for forever adoption. Success Stories

We have had several very hard medical cases in the last eight months. Trinity is a dog that came from Nebraska. She had been forced to chew off the bottom portion of her own rear leg in order to escape from an illegal trap. Trinity was also emaciated, had every parasite imaginable, and was rather nervous with all the people at NSC that were willing to help. Within a few months (as well as a few surgeries) she was up and functioning as a tri-pod, and ready for a family to call her own. She has since been adopted, and could not be happier.

Midas was a sheltie puppy that had a broken leg and was slated to be euthanized if no one would transfer him. With his sweet face and stellar personality, NSC signed up to help see him through recovery. Because of the small surplus of medical funds we have on hand, we are able to intervene in these types of cases so the animal does not have to face death when they are perfectly capable of healing with the right veterinary care. All adoptions through NSC come with 4 weeks of training to facilitate the transition into a new home.



Amos is an 8 year old Pomeranian mix whose owner is having to move into an assisted living facility. He is missing a few teeth but is a very happy lap puppy that loves to snuggle. Amos would do best if he

could be placed with his brother Snooky. He is house trained, knows basic obedience, and would make a great companion for the rest of his many years.



Snooky is a 10 year old Maltese mix whose owner is having to move into an assisted living facility. He is a little slow, but a very happy lap puppy that loves to snuggle. Snooky would do best if he could

be placed with his brother Amos. He is house trained, knows basic obedience, and would make a great companion for the rest of her many years.



Cloud is a 6 year old purebred white German shepherd. She is a very sweet gal who has some basic obedience already nailed (she walks well on a leash, is house trained and crate trained). She was

at an overcrowded shelter where her time was about up, and sadly it seems that her family lost her and didn't bother to look for her (because she is such a nice dog we can't believe anyone would give her up on purpose).

Aries is a 4 year old purebred German shepherd, originally from Kansas where he had been picked up as a stray. He is a gorgeous dog that needs to put on a little weight but is very friendly. Due to his

time spent fending for himself, he cannot go to a home with little dogs or cats as he sees them as prey animals. He does fine with medium to large size dogs and with kids. Aries does have Paris, an eye condition that is very cheap to treat with daily eye drops (if interested, check with your vet to find out what the monthly cost would be). He is crate and house trained and brushing up on general manners.



Prudie is a 1 year old cardigan Welsh corgi mix (she looks just like a purebred corgi, but is on the tiny size at around 12 pounds). She can be a bit fearful in new situations, which is why she was originally

on death row at the municipal shelter. With a little patience and love she warms right up and is a very happy munchkin. Prudie is spayed, 100% house trained, crate trained, up to date on vaccinations and ready for a home with people who are willing to be understanding that sometimes for small creatures, loud and big things can be scary. She has mixed reactions with other dogs, and will either chase cats or act scared of them (so it's hard to say if she's good with cats - her interactions with felines are not very consistent). She is a wonderful sweet pup who deserves a second chance in life.



Adoptable Pets



Jade is a 1 year old shepherd, possibly husky mix that had originally been found as a stray. She is about 55 pounds and can be a bit timid in new situations, but once she warms up she is a very friendly dog.

She is crate trained, house trained, working on being polite on a leash and brushing up on her general manners. She would do best in a home without cats or small dogs.



Jezebel is a playful 6 year old that wants your love and affection. She enjoys fetching, taking walks, being groomed—she has a beautiful coat—and anything else that lets her know you care. Jezebel is

good with people of all ages once introduced. She is being relinquished due to her owner's disability which makes it impossible for her to care for her. She is a good and loyal friend and companion.



Nadia is a 13 year old purebred German shepherd who was an owner relinquishment due to a housing change. She is house trained, crate trained, knows general obedience and mostly

just wants to be someone's shadow. While we understand that adopting a senior dog of this age would be more a gesture of kindness while she lives out the rest of her days, we are also hoping to get some donations to help care for her in her golden years.



Raksha is a gorgeous 2 year old long hair calico that was saved from deplorable conditions with her day old kittens. Sadly all her babies died because of the rough start and their little bodies couldn't make

it. Raksha got better, is spayed, excellent with all ages of children and will tolerate dogs. She has had all her shots, and is microchipped. She is an indoor kitty with some time spent outdoors lover ready for her new home. She will stay in the yard and snooze in the sun without wandering away.



Kittens NSC has several litters of kittens currently in various stages of development that will be coming up for adoption soon. There are a number of different mixes (Maine Coon, Siamese and others) as well and different coat lengths, colors and sexes. Gretchen's Goodies

Cocker-Cranberry Liver Brownies

Ingredients

- 1 pound beef liver
- 4 eggs
- ½ cup fresh cranberries
- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 cup cornmeal



Directions

- Puree all of the ingredients in a food processor. Blend until well mixed.
- Grease two 9 inch square pans, and pour half of the batter into each pan.
- Bake at 400°F for 30 minutes, or until the dough springs back when touched.
- Cut out shapes with cookie cutters or just cut the brownies into squares.
- Refrigerate treats after cooking.

Canine Trivia

Puppies are not as simple as letting "nature take its course" or allowing your children to "experience the miracle of birth." Twenty-five percent (25%) of dog births turn into middle-of-the-night c-sections, which adds up to a \$1,000 vet bill for the whelping alone. Fading puppies can also cost several thousand dollars to save, and it is very possible for puppies to contract viruses such as mild Coccidia, Giardia, and the more serious threat of Parvo. It is possible your female will not produce milk, or make too much and end up with mastitis. Your female could also hemorrhage. Studies have shown dogs are not better tempered if allowed to breed or if they remain intact. Spaying and neutering is the most effective way to protect the lives and happiness of your animals and your family.
